It is home to students interested in the *arts* (fine and practical), the *media* (print and broadcast), and *research and writing* (creative and critical).



Arts and Letters

AB Humanities is premised on the important role of the arts and letters in shaping the perspective of the students. *Exposure to the great ideas and achievements in the arts* enables students to *navigate a complex world*.

Intellectual Maturity

Our mission is to develop graduates who are sensitive, aware and appreciative of ideas and passions that have shaped the world, and are infused with *rigorous rational inquiry* and equipped with *intellectual maturity* to form and articulate ideas.



Liberal Education

The program hopes to instill the ideas of intellectual tolerance, love and liberty of thought, and the belief in the essential dignity of human beings—a liberal education for *genuine human liberation*.



The program is ideal for students who have a passion for the *humanities*, are interested in investigating *cultural phenomena* and *artistic-philosophical problems*, and value *life-long learning and self-cultivation*.

Program Learning Objectives

Apart from being able to do what the revised Ateneo Core Curriculum envisions them as doing, the graduates of the AB Humanities program should be able to:

1. demonstrate familiarity with key concepts, authors, developments, and works in two or three areas of the humanities;

2. analyze objects (whether texts, issues, phenomena) in the humanities using and integrating appropriate concepts or theories;
